INCREASE IN TRANSCRIPT FEE RATES

On September 18, 2007, the Judicial Conference of the United States approved a ten percent increase to the maximum page rates that may be charged for court transcripts. The Judicial Conference also approved creation of a 14-day category of transcript delivery to fill the wide gap between ordinary (30-day) and expedited (7-day) delivery times.

Chief District Judge A. Joe Fish has issued Miscellaneous Order No. 4 authorizing court reporters for the Northern District of Texas to charge the maximum rates as approved. The following transcript fee rates are effective October 22, 2007:

Daily Transcript	\$6.05	\$1.20	\$0.90
Hourly Transcript	\$7.25	\$1.20	\$0.90
Realtime Transcript	\$3.05	\$1.20	-

Transcripts ordered prior to adoption of the new rates should be billed at the rates in effect at the time the order was placed with the official court reporter.
