GENERAL ORDER 2022-02

To provide an equitable distribution of the caseload in the Northern District of Texas, all Chapter 11 cases filed with estimated assets or liabilities of more than \$50 million (a "Mega Case") will be assigned in rotating order to each judge in the division in which the case is filed, with any affiliated cases assigned to the same judge. A party filing a Mega Case in the Court's electronic case filing system shall select "Mega Docket DAL" or "Mega Docket FTW," as applicable, when prompted to select an office in which to file a new Mega Case in the Dallas or Fort Worth divisions. If the judge listed under "Next Mega Case Assignment" in the applicable division is not assigned to the Mega Case because the filer did not make such selection, the Clerk of the Court shall reassign such case to the judge listed with a notation on the docket of the reassignment. All other cases will be assigned by random draw as follows:

Dallas Division
