



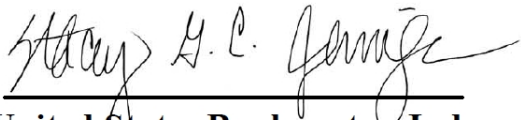

**GENERAL ORDER
2023-02**

In an effort to address the health and safety of the public during the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Court entered General Orders 2020-07, 2020-09, and 2020-15, temporarily suspending the requirement that attorneys receive and maintain “wet signatures” on certain documents requiring a client’s or other third party’s signature, prior to filing the document with the Court.

Due to the nearing end of the public health emergency declaration necessitated by COVID-19, the Court has determined that it will rescind General Order 2020-15, effective April 1, 2023. Counsel shall continue to maintain wet signatures in their files in accordance with the Administrative Procedures for the Filing, Signing, and Verifying of Documents by Electronic Means in Texas Bankruptcy Courts. Additionally, within seven (7) business days of the filing by electronic means of a bankruptcy petition, list, schedule, or statement that requires verification or

an unsworn declaration, the appropriate Declaration for Electronic Filing described in Part III(B)(3) of those procedures must be signed and filed with the Court.
